#### God Meets Us Where We Are



Around this time of the church year, Scripture readings concerning 'doubting Thomas' inevitably arise. Some would say that it is a perennial favorite to preach/hear about post Easter Sunday. Those of you following our worship services, however, will know that wasn't the case this year.

So, in part out of my personal guilt, but largely because of my belief in the importance of the message behind 'doubting' Thomas, I wish to take this opportunity to share some thoughts concerning this interesting story.

Personally, the notion of 'doubt' looming over the name of 'Thomas' is something I had struggled with for some time. My hope here is to have another look into this Scripture passage, to mine for additional wisdom.

It is tempting to label this particular Scripture (e.g. John 20:24-27) with the title, "An Account of Doubting Thomas." Doing so, we'd be in line with the cultural understanding of our times. But is it really about Thomas the character that is synonymous with the notion of 'doubt'? Let's just say that I subscribe to a school of thought that believes this account is really about Jesus, wherein Thomas plays a part.

Now, going back into the Easter scene itself, and following Mary's frantic declaration to other disciples that the tomb in which Jesus was buried was empty, a myriad of emotions including utter disbelief – struck the disciples. Our Thomas was no exception.

But Thomas took that disbelief a step further and established out loud the conditions for his faith: *The only way that he would believe in Mary's proclamation – that the Lord has risen* – was if he could physically verify the Lord's bodily wounds!

Without a doubt Thomas would have been scorned by some at the time. Still, you have to give Thomas some credit for blurting out what many of us would have questioned or harbored deep in our hearts, should we have been there at the time!

Jesus, however, does not censure Thomas for these conditions, his attitude at the moment, but instead makes available to him exactly what he needed for faith. For Jesus, Thomas' faith is more important than the conditions for arriving at the faith; so, Jesus presents his post-resurrection body to Thomas to physically verify. This is indeed confirmed by Jesus' words to Thomas, "Do not doubt but believe" (John 20:27).

We all know that Jesus' gracious offer leads to Thomas making a sincere confession of faith.

More importantly, Thomas' confession of faith happened because our Lord Jesus came to where Thomas was at that particular



moment of his life. Thomas, seemingly the 'black sheep' of the flock, would not be left behind by the Shepherd.

Suffice to say, all of this is in character with what the Holy Scripture has testified to all along. Jesus, the Son of God, cared for his flock; this did not end with his death, but continued to all beyond death.

Knowing all of this, I find this to be a very hopeful message for all of us today; hopeful that no matter what our grounds of faith may be (i.e. wherever we may be in life, whatever challenges we may be facing...things and conditions that hold us back from receiving Jesus into our lives), we have Scripture's promise that we too will experience the grace of God in Jesus!

The Session met on Tuesday, April 4, 2023 at 7pm. Twelve elders attended, including the moderator, Rev. Dr. Kim. The meeting opened with prayer and a reflection about sharing the gospel message, from 1 Corinthians 2:1-5.

#### Updates:

- Plans continue to elect one elder in the near term. Information was disseminated to the congregation in the Knox News.
- Plans continue for the photo-directory for our 190<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

#### Visioning and Caring:

The Session discussed attendance and membership. We feel that we are a welcoming church, but need to continue and develop this.

#### **Ministry Reports:**

**Christian Education Committee** – A design team was established to lead the Knox Kids' Camp and develop Sunday School curriculum.

**Children's Choir ministry** – A committee was formed to direct this activity. First aid certification will be required.

**Leading With Care** - The fire drill will be planned for June 18. Some people expressed interest in first aid training on Sept 30, but more certified responders are needed.

**Mission** – The director has been hired for Kids' Camp. Fewer staff will be hired this year in order to reduce expenses.

**Pastoral Care** - Weekly coffee fellowships continue with many volunteering to host. Prayer link, prayer shawl and guided meditation ministries are all working well.

**Board of Stewards** – The local Muslim community is using the Knox kitchen and dining hall for its Eid celebrations at the end of Ramadan.

**Worship** – There is very little usage of the Phone Live Streaming service we have in place. **Communion** will be served with gluten-free bread.

**New Business** - The annual church picnic is planned for June 25.

## **Grilled Pork Salad with Strawberries**

YIELDS: 4 - 6 serving(s) PREP TIME: 30 mins TOTAL TIME: 30 mins



#### Ingredients

- 2 tsp. ground coriander
- 1 tsp. ground ginger
- 1 tbsp. plus 2 teaspoons packed light brown sugar
- 4 1-inch-thick boneless pork loin chops (about
- 1 3/4 pounds total)
- 1 tsp. kosher salt
- Black pepper, to taste
- 6 tbsp. olive oil
- 2 tsp. Dijon mustard
- 2 tbsp. balsamic vinegar
- 2 c. strawberries, hulled and quartered
- 1 5-ounce package mixed greens
- 1 4-ounce log goat cheese, crumbled
- 1/3 c. chopped fresh chives

#### Directions

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°. Combine the coriander, ginger and 1 tablespoon brown sugar in a small bowl. Season the pork chops with ½ teaspoon salt and a few grinds of pepper and rub with the spice mixture.
- 2. Heat a large cast-iron skillet over medium-high heat and drizzle with 2 tablespoons olive oil. Add the pork chops and cook until browned, 1 to 2 minutes per side.
- 3. Put the skillet in the oven and roast until the pork is just cooked through and a thermometer inserted into the pork registers 145°, about 10 minutes. Let rest 5 minutes on a cutting board while you make the salad.
- 4. Whisk the mustard, vinegar, remaining 2 teaspoons brown sugar, ½ teaspoon salt and a few grinds of pepper in a large bowl. Whisk in the remaining ¼ cup olive oil in a slow, steady stream until smooth.
- 5. Add the strawberries to the dressing and toss to coat. Add the greens and toss again. Slice the pork and layer on top of the salad. Sprinkle with the goat cheese and chives.
