"Time of Reflection and Stillness"



No sooner we have entered the New Year that we are on the cusp of embracing the Lent Season. Officially, the first Sunday in Lent commences on February 18th, 2024.

Depending on who you ask, lots of opinions will be shared as to what Lent symbolizes. Generally speaking, Lent is a time of deep reflection and stillness before the soul stirring story of Jesus' life and ministry, especially in regards to his suffering, death, and resurrection. There is much for us to discover and reflect upon; thus, we begin our long journey ahead of us.

But as part of our Lenten journey, we remember that the same 'demons' long ago had their final shriek at our Lord Jesus as he hung on the cross, challenging and mocking him on the validity of his authority! But hanging on that cross, our Lord Jesus completed the healing work he began on that day when he boldly spoke in the synagogue and began his ministry of healing, and transformation.

So let us ready ourselves to embark on this Lenten journey together. And by the grace of God, may you find liberation from your own fear, and in turn, may your presence in this world, as the 'salt and light of the world,' help liberate others.

"Saviour, Like a Shepherd Lead Us" is a well-loved hymn and it's found in the Book of Praise, among many other hymn books.

Although sometimes ascribed to either Henry F. Lyte or Dorothy A. Thrupp, this text is the work of an unknown author.

The text is a prayer for divine guidance and obedience to God's will. Psalm 23 and the parable of the good shepherd (John 10:18) were the inspiration for verses 1 and 2; the remaining verses contain other biblical phrases.

The tune name is RHUDDLAN, and it is a traditional Welsh tune used by harp-playing folk musicians. It's named after the historic village in northern Wales, and the tune was published in 1800, followed by the harmonization in 1906.

The third verse's text is as follows:

"Let us always seek your favour; let us always do your will.
Jesus Christ our only Saviour, with yourself our spirits fill: blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus! you have loved us; love us still.
Blessed Jesus, blessed Jesus! you have loved us; love us still."

Recipe





This chicken Cordon Bleu casserole has all the creamy and wonderful flavor of the traditional dish with a little of the fat and hassle removed.

Prep Time: 10 mins Cook Time: 45 mins Total Time: 55 mins

Ingredients

1 (8 ounce) package wide egg noodles

2 cups chopped cooked chicken breast (rotisserie chicken is a great shortcut!)

8 ounces cooked ham, cubed

8 ounces Swiss cheese, cubed

1 (10.5 ounce) can reduced-fat, reduced-sodium cream of chicken soup

1/2 cup 2% milk

1/2 cup light sour cream

2 tablespoons butter

1/3 cup seasoned bread crumbs

1/4 cup grated Parmesan cheese

Directions

Gather all ingredients.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Lightly grease a 9x13-inch casserole dish. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Cook egg noodles in boiling water, stirring occasionally, until tender yet firm to the bite, 7 to 9 minutes. Drain and transfer noodles to the prepared casserole dish.

Top noodles with chicken, ham, and Swiss cheese.

Mix together condensed soup, milk, and sour cream in a medium bowl until combined; spoon over noodle mixture in the casserole dish.

Melt butter in a skillet over medium heat; cook and stir bread crumbs and Parmesan cheese in hot butter until crumbs are well coated, 2 to 3 minutes. Sprinkle over casserole.

Bake in the preheated oven until casserole is bubbling and lightly browned, about 30 minutes. Allow to cool slightly before serving.

My mom wants me to name my kids after people in our family, so I'm naming my firstborn "Uncle Karl".


