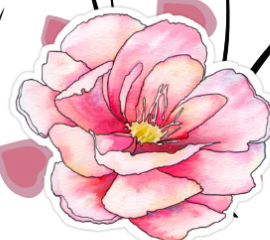

CHILDREN’S CHOIR MINISTRY – A Valentine’s Day spaghetti supper is being planned with Kaos and adult choir involvement to raise funds for Kaos and the children's choir ministry.

BOARD OF STEWARDS - There was a flood in the basement after a heavy rain in January and the stewards are investigating the root cause.

RESTORATION COMMITTEE – Work should start in May.

TRUSTEES – Received \$10,000 from the Willsie Estate for the Memorial Fund.

MINISTER’S REPORT – In the new year, we look for discernment and then to act. Considering James 1:17, we are stewards of God's gifts and talents to be deployed for the community of faith and beyond. We have many strong programs at Knox for this.

Music 🎵 Moment

Best Wishes for February, the shorter month in winter.



George Frederic Handel was born on February 23, 1685. He was born in the same year as J.S. Bach and Domenico Scarlatti, and his composing style developed rather differently.

Handel (1685- 1759) became a musician and composer despite objections from his father, who wanted him to become a lawyer. He studied music with Zachau, organist at the Halle Cathedral, and became an accomplished violinist and keyboard performer. He traveled and studied in Italy for some time and then settled permanent in England in 1713.

Although he wrote a large number of instrumental works, he is known mainly for his Italian operas and oratorios (including Messiah, 1741), various anthems for church and royal festivities, and organ concertos, which he interpolated into his oratorio performances. He composed only three hymn tunes and interestingly enough the Book of Praise contains them. The most well-known is called "MACCABEUS", #258 in the hymn book - "Thine Be the Glory" – and is a well-loved Easter hymn.

Handel is reported to have said to a friend "you will live to see it (the tune) a greater favourite with the people than my other finer things."

Tips from the Canadian Red Cross

Have you checked out the Canadian Red Cross App on your phone lately? You know...the one with the BandAid! There are many tips to help us remain healthy and to assist others who may not be so healthy. Here is one from the App and there are others to follow in the future!

FROST BITE - Tip #9



Make sure your hands, feet, and face are covered and kept warm when in cold conditions. A person with superficial frost bite may have flushed skin. The exposed cold area may also experience changes in sensation such as numbness, burning, tingling or pain. The exposed skin may be cold, feel hard to the touch, waxy or become blistered. If symptoms are severe seek medical help. If only a mild case, warm the affected area with warm water or body heat until the skin becomes red or purple in appearance, soft and pliable to the touch. Do not rub skin or break any blisters.

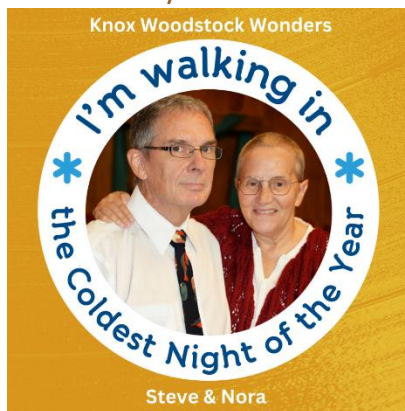

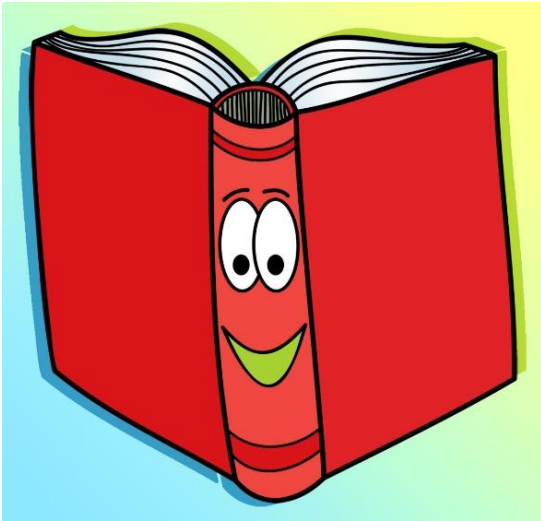
Our team goal this year is to raise \$1500.00. We can do it, with your help!

One Pot Spaghetti –

One Pot Spaghetti and Meat Sauce

This One Pot Spaghetti and Meat Sauce recipe cooks in a large pot or Dutch oven for an easy meal the whole family loves. This one pot pasta is ready in just 30 minutes with easy clean-up too!

Ingredients

- ½ yellow onion chopped
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 1½ pounds lean ground beef
- 1 tablespoon Italian seasoning
- 1 ½ teaspoons sea salt
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- ½ teaspoon ground black pepper
- pinch red pepper flakes optional
- 1 16-ounce [package spaghetti uncooked and broken in half](#)
- 1 24-ounce [jar marinara sauce](#)
- 1 15-ounce can diced tomatoes undrained
- 3 cups water or beef broth

Instructions

1. In a large Dutch oven or heavy bottom pot, heat olive oil over medium heat, add the onion, and cook until slightly soft
2. Add the ground beef, and cook until no longer pink. Drain beef if necessary, then add Italian seasoning blend, sea salt, garlic powder, black pepper, red pepper flakes (optional), and stir
3. Add the spaghetti noodles, marinara sauce, diced tomatoes and water, and stir well, pushing the noodles under the liquid and separating them so they don't stick
4. Cover, and bring to low boil over medium high heat, then remove cover, and stir frequently to make sure pasta doesn't stick and noodles aren't clumping together. Reduce heat to medium, if necessary
5. When pasta is al dente or done to your liking, remove from heat, add some grated Parmesan cheese and chopped parsley, if desired, and enjoy!

Notes

Make sure to break the spaghetti noodles in half before adding to the pot.

You can use more marinara sauce or tomato sauce in place of diced tomatoes.

If you are using a jar of spaghetti sauce larger than 26 ounces, you may want to skip the diced tomatoes or use 2 cups water.

ingredients

- 1 cup whipping cream
- 1 tbsp sugar
- 1/2 tsp vanilla
- 2 cup frozen raspberries (see recipe tips)
- 1/2 cup sugar

instructions

1. Using a mixer, whip together the whipping cream, 1 tbsp sugar, and the vanilla. Set aside.
2. In a food processor blend together the frozen raspberries and 1/2 cup sugar.
3. Once the raspberries have been blended, fold them in to the whipping cream. I do this by using a spatula.
4. Evenly distribute the dessert between 4-5 dessert cups or fancy glasses.
5. Refrigerate until you are ready to enjoy! (see recipe tips)
